### **Revenues and profit of Silvano declined in third quarter**

The revenues of Silvano Fashion Group SFG1T reached EUR 49.835 million during the first nine months of this year, which was 0.5% less than a year ago. A total of EUR 16.302 million of that amount was reached in the third quarter (y-o-y change: -5.5%; LHV's estimate was EUR 18.5 mln). The company's EBITDA during the same period grew by 30.1% on year to EUR 17.113 million. Net profit (attributable to shareholders of the parent company) increased by 5.9% in the nine month period to EUR 9.858 million (net profit earned in the third quarter was EUR 2.201 million, declining by 43.2% on year; LHV's estimate was EUR 4.4 mln), Silvano told the stock exchange on Friday evening.

### **Number of passengers of TS Laevad exceeds two million for the first time**

The number of passengers traveling via ferries between the Estonian large islands and the continent exceeded for the first time the bar of 2 million passengers during the ten months of this year, the ferry traffic operator TS Laevad, a subsidiary of Tallinna Sadam TSM1T, announced on Saturday. Compared to the same period last year, the number of passengers has increased by 2% and the number of vehicles by 4%.

### **Baltic ports raise cargo turnover by 3.2% in nine months**

In the first nine months of 2018, all Baltic ports together received and shipped 116.092 million tonnes of cargo, which was 3.2% more than in the respective period last year, according to the data released on Monday by the Latvian statistical bureau.

### **Latvian exports of goods up 8.3% in nine months, imports rise 10.2%**

During the first nine months of this year Latvia exported EUR 9.052 billion worth of goods, up by 8.3% against the same period last year, while Latvian imports grew 10.2% to EUR 11.438 billion, according to the latest foreign trade data released on Friday by the Central Statistical Bureau.

### **Lithuania's exports rise 7.6% from January-September, imports up 8.6%**

Lithuania's exports rose by 7.6% in January through September 2018 from a year earlier to reach EUR 20.675 billion and its imports grew by 8.6% to EUR 22.749 billion, Statistics Lithuania said on Friday.
